



SCRAPPING A TAX & DUTY-FREE VEHICLE



1. What documents do I need to scrap my vehicle?

	Document	Remarks
A	C104A	Issued to you by SBA Customs when you initially imported or purchased the vehicle.
B	Certificate of Ownership (Cyprus Logbook)	If your bank is detailed on the logbook as co-owner then a Transfer of Ownership (TOM9) or a letter from your bank confirming permission to scrap, is required
C	Valid Road-Tax	Or SORN certificate if vehicle has been legally declared off the road.

2. What do I do if the Road-Tax has expired?

You must pay any outstanding road-tax to the Republic of Cyprus Department of Road Transport. If your vehicle does not have a MOT or road-tax, you must visit the Department of Transport to legally declare your vehicle off the road and pay any back tax. You can then use the SORN certificate and receipt in place of the valid road-tax certificate when applying for the vehicle destruction.

3. Where do I complete the application for destruction?

Applications for official destruction are only processed by SBA Customs. Please email any of our offices in order to obtain the initial application.

4. What happens next?

Once the application for destruction has been completed, SBA Customs will notify the approved recovery contractor who will make the necessary arrangements to meet you in order to recover your vehicle and documents. The recovery contractor will then take your vehicle for official destruction.

Should the contractor require access to the Station to recover your vehicle then you will be responsible for sponsoring and escorting them onto, and around, the site.

Once your vehicle has been destroyed, your destruction certificate will be returned to SBA Customs who will delete the vehicle from our records. A copy of the certificate will be available on request. Please keep in mind that the certificate can take a few months to be returned to SBA Customs.

5. How much will it cost to scrap my vehicle?

Currently, it costs €90.00 to scrap your vehicle. This is a payment for the witnessing of destruction by Republic of Cyprus Customs Officials. You will be required to make this payment in cash to the approved recovery contractor responsible for collecting your vehicle and documents.
