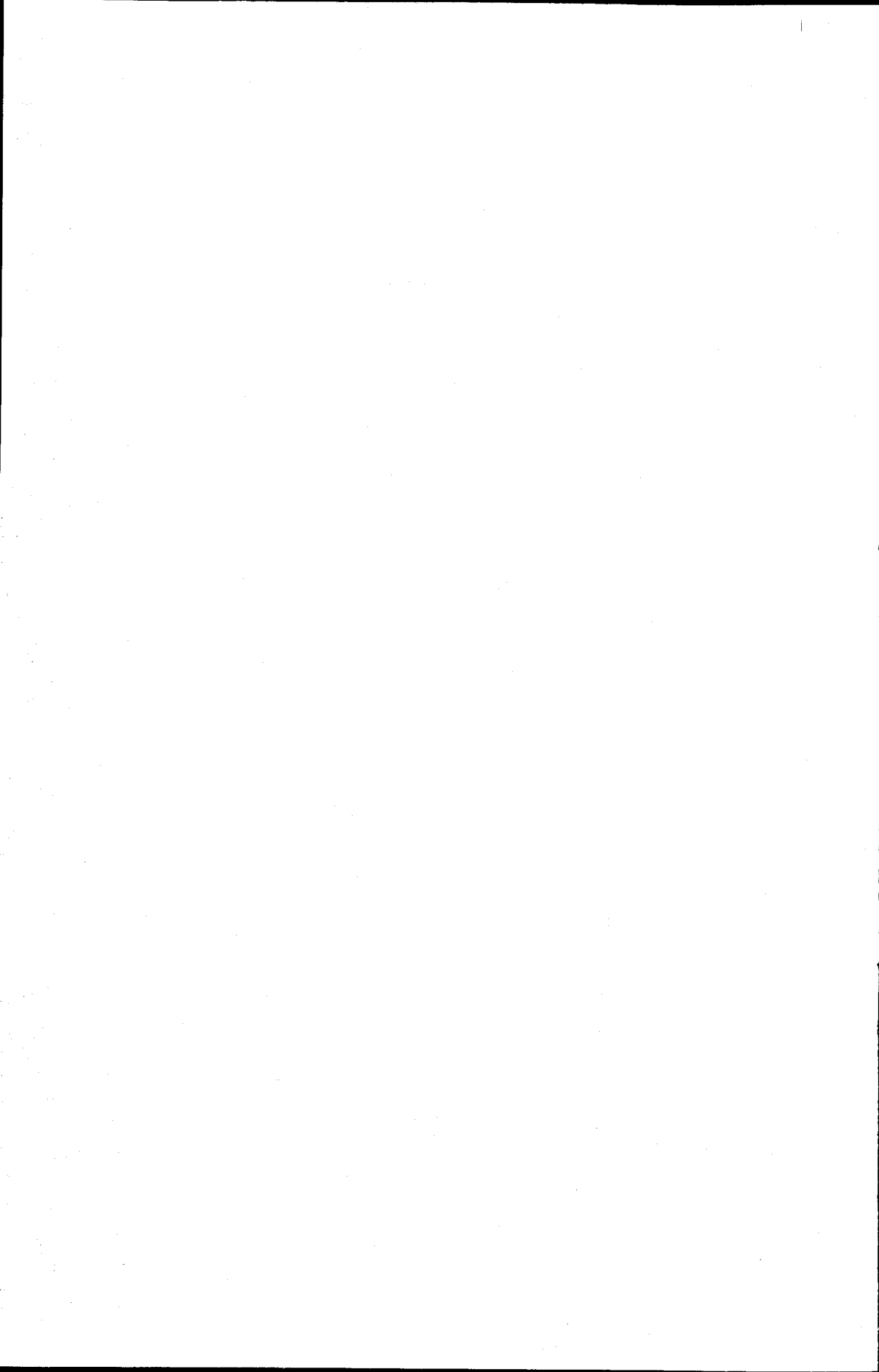

CHAPTER 111.

PASSPORTS (FALSE REPRESENTATIONS).

TO AMEND THE CRIMINAL LAWS.

1. This Law may be cited as the Passports (False Representations) Law. Short title.

2. If any person shall for the purpose of obtaining a passport make any false representation or any statement false in a material particular he shall be liable in respect of each offence to imprisonment not exceeding one year or to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine. False representation or statement in regard to passports.
