ORDINANCE 3 OF 1991.

AN ORDINANCE

TO AMEND THE FISHERIES (CONSOLIDATION)
ORDINANCE.

6th March, 1991.

BE it enacted by the Administrator of the Sovereign Base Areas of Akrotiri and Dhekelia as follows :—

- 1.** This Ordinance may be cited as the Fisheries (Consolidation) (Amendment) (No.1) Ordinance, 1991 and shall be read as one with the Fisheries (Consolidation) Ordinance, 1982 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Ordinance”).

- 2.** Section 3 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the words “twenty-five” appearing in the fifth line of subsection (2) thereof and substituting therefor the words “five hundred”.

Section 3 of the principal Ordinance amended.
- 3.** Section 5 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the word “three” appearing in the penultimate line thereof and substituting therefor the word “five”.

Section 5 of the principal Ordinance amended.
- 4.** Section 6 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting subsection (3) thereof and substituting therefor the following new subsections (3) and (3A):—

Section 6 of the principal Ordinance amended.

“(3) Any person contravening any Regulation made under the provisions of this Section, except for one relating to matters of water pollution, shall be guilty of an offence and shall on first conviction for such offence, be liable to a fine not exceeding five thousand pounds and on subsequent conviction for such an offence shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding five thousand pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine.

(3A) Any person contravening any Regulation made under the provisions of this Section which relates to matters of water pollution, shall be guilty of an offence and shall on first conviction for such an offence be liable to a fine not exceeding thirty thousand pounds and on subsequent conviction for such an offence shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding thirty thousand pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine.”.

ORDINANCE 4 OF 1991.

AN ORDINANCE

TO AMEND THE AKROTIRI VILLAGE (SPECIAL PROVISIONS)
ORDINANCE.

BE it enacted by the Administrator of the Sovereign Base Areas of Akrotiri and Dhekelia as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Akrotiri Village (Special Provisions) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1991 and shall be read as one with the Akrotiri Village (Special Provisions) Ordinance, 1966 as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Ordinance.”).

2. Section 4G of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended:—

(a) by deleting the full stops and inverted commas appearing after the word “Officer” at the end of the proviso to subsection (4) thereof, and

(b) by adding immediately thereafter the following:—

“or with the Co-Operative Credit Society of Akrotiri village.”.

ORDINANCE 5 OF 1991.

AN ORDINANCE

TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONSERVATION OF WATER

BE it enacted by the Administrator of the Sovereign Base Areas of Akrotiri and Dhekelia as follows :—

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Water Supply (Conservation Measures) Ordinance, 1991.

Interpretation

2. In this Ordinance unless the context otherwise requires—

“affected area” means an area affected by drought declared under subsection (1) of Section 3 of this Ordinance;

“appliance” includes hose-pipes, taps, cocks, cisterns and other similar apparatus used in connection with the supply of water.

Declaration of an area as an affected area.

3.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in any other Ordinance contained, if the Administrator is satisfied that a serious shortage or deficiency of water exists or is likely to exist within a certain area and that measures for the conservation of water resources and maintenance of water supplies in such area are necessary, he may by an Order to be published in the Gazette, declare such area as an area affected by drought and thereupon, the provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to such area.

(2) The Administrator may, if satisfied that the circumstances which led to the making of an Order under subsection (1) of this Section have ceased to exist, cancel such Order and upon such cancellation, the provisions of this Ordinance shall cease to apply to the affected area.

Regulations

4.—(1) The Administrator may, in respect of an affected area and notwithstanding anything in any other Ordinance contained, make Regulations to be published in the Gazette for preventing waste or undue consumption in the affected area and generally to carry into effect the provisions of this Ordinance.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of subsection (1) of this Section any such Regulation may include provisions:—

- (a) forbidding the use for any purpose of any appliance which is of such a nature or so arranged or so connected as to cause or permit waste or undue consumption of water;
- (b) regulating or restricting the supply of water available to domestic consumers.

(3) Any person who fails to comply with or contravenes any of the provisions of such Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to imprisonment not exceeding three months or to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine.
