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**THE GAME AND WILD BIRDS
(PROTECTION AND DEVELOPMENT) ORDINANCE, 1974**

(Ordinances 11 of 1974 and 1 of 1982).

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 27 (1) (b).

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of Section 27 of the Game and Wild Birds (Protection and Development) Ordinance, 1974 the Area Officer Akrotiri, with the approval of the Chief Officer, hereby authorises any holder of a valid game licence to shoot, take or pursue turtle-doves, wood pigeons, rock-pigeons, quail and bee-eaters, including such vermin as sparrows, crows, magpies, jackdaws and foxes, in the areas set out in the Schedule hereto during the period commencing on the 22nd April, 1984 and ending on the 13th May, 1984 (other than the 4th, 5th and 6th May, 1984) subject to the following terms and conditions:—

- (a) shooting shall take place between sunrise and sunset only ;
- (b) there shall be no shooting within 200 yards of any Service installations or within 100 yards of the perimeter of the Royal Air Force Station Akrotiri ;
- (c) no fires shall be kindled ;
- (d) there shall be no shooting within 200 yards of any village built-up area or in any private fenced up land ;
- (e) no farm or other cultivated land where there is a risk of damage being caused to fruit trees, vegetable gardens, citrus plantations, cereal crops or vineyards shall be entered ;
- (f) hunters shall carry with them their game licence, their gun possession licence and the certificate of registration of their gun.

SCHEDULE

AREA 'A'

All that area in the Akrotiri Sovereign Base Area which lies south of boundary pillars 266 to 242 ; thence in a westerly direction along the boundary of the Akrotiri Main State Forest up to the Upper Marsh ('Pano Livadhi') tarmac road ; thence along that road as far as its junction with an earth road and thence in a straight line due west as far as the coast, other than any game reserves which lie within the said area.

AREA 'B'

All that area east of the Kouris river south of the M. 1 road and bounded on the east by Fassouri Game Reserve, except where indicated on the ground by sign-posts.

AREA 'C'

All that area which lies south of Limassol - Ypsonas road, commencing from boundary pillar 188 and ending at boundary pillar 146; thence the boundary runs due south along the Sovereign Base Area boundary up to the junction of the Trakhoni - Kolossi link road on the main Phassouri - Kolossi road; thence along the former road up to boundary pillar 201, excluding any game reserves and certain lands which lie between the two main earth tracks which branch off the old Kolossi - Zakaki road and converge on a track south of the Ypsonas - Kolossi main road, the area banned for shooting in this particular pocket of lands having been properly signposted on the ground.

**THE SOCIAL INSURANCE (FACILITATION OF
REPUBLICAN SOCIAL INSURANCE SCHEME)
ORDINANCE, 1980**

(Ordinance 16 of 1980 and 5 of 1983).

**REGULATIONS MADE BY THE ADMINISTRATOR
UNDER SECTION 18.**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 18 of the Social Insurance (Facilitation of Republican Social Insurance Scheme) Ordinance, 1980, the Administrator hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Social Insurance (Contributions) (Amendment) Regulations, 1984 and shall be read as one with the Social Insurance (Contributions) Regulations, 1980, as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Regulations”).

2. Regulation 8 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting paragraph (1) thereof and substituting therefor the following new paragraph :—

“8.—(1) The maximum limit of insurable earnings shall be one hundred and thirty two pounds weekly (£132) and five hundred and seventy two pounds monthly (£572).

3. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by deleting Regulation 9 thereof and substituting therefor the following new Regulation :—

“9. The weekly amount of basic insurable earnings shall be twenty two pounds (£22) and the annual amount thereof one thousand and one hundred and forty four pounds (£1,144).

4. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by deleting Regulation 22 thereof and substituting therefor the following new Regulation :—

“22—(1) Every employer or self-employed person who fails to pay a contribution within the period prescribed in these Regulations shall be liable to pay an additional charge calculated on a percentage basis on the unpaid contributions in relation to the period such contribution is in arrear.

(2) The percentage referred to in paragraph (1) of this Regulation shall be five per centum for any contribution in arrear up to one month, increased by three units in respect of each subsequent month of delay or part thereof. The amount of additional charge shall be calculated to the nearest cent :

Provided that the amount of additional charge shall not exceed the amount of one hundred per centum of contributions in arrear :

Provided further that in respect of self-employed persons to whom paragraph 5 of Regulation 17 applies, no additional charge shall be payable before the expiration of the second calendar month from the date on which the Chief Officer has made his decision.

(3) Notwithstanding any of the provisions of paragraph (1) and (2), a self-employed person shall not be liable to pay an additional charge with regard to contributions in arrear for the years 1982 and 1983 if he pays such contributions within the period prescribed in the Schedule to these Regulations according to the number of quarters for which contributions are in arrear.

5. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by deleting the Schedule thereto and substituting therefor the new Schedule appearing in these Regulations.

6. Regulation 8 (1) of the principal Regulations, shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of the Contribution month of February, 1984.

7. Regulation 9 of the principal Regulations, shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st January, 1984.

THE COURTS ORDINANCE

RULES OF COURT UNDER SECTION 63.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by Section 63 of the Courts Ordinance, 1960 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Administrator hereby makes the following Rules:-

1. These Rules may be cited as the Civil Procedure (Increase of Advocates' Fees) (Special Provisions) (Amendment) Rules, 1984 and shall be read as one with the Civil Procedure Rules, as amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Rules").

2. The Advocates' fees provided for in Appendix B of the principal Rules are hereby increased by thirty per centum (30%) of their existing scales in cases where the subject matter or the amount recovered exceeds £100 (hundred pounds).

3. These Rules shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1984.

THE ANNUAL HOLIDAYS WITH PAY ORDINANCE

(Ordinances 10 of 1973, 12 of 1979 and 21 of 1980)

DESIGNATION OF CHAIRMAN OF ARBITRATION TRIBUNAL
UNDER SECTION 16 (3).

In exercise of the powers vested in him by subsection (3) of Section 16 of the Annual Holidays with Pay Ordinance, 1973 the Administrator, with the concurrence of the Senior Judge, hereby designates the Honourable Mr. Justice T.O.
