THE FOREST ORDINANCE, 1980.
(Ordinances 14 of 1980, 16 of 1987 and 20 of 1988).

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE ADMINISTRATOR
UNDER SECTION 24.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by Section 24 of the Forest Ordinance, 1980 the Administrator hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Forest (Amendment) Regulations, 1991 and shall be read as one with the Forest Regulations, 1980 as amended by the Forest (Amendment) Regulations, 1988 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Regulations”).

and 84/88.

2. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by deleting Regulation 17 thereof and substituting therefor the following new Regulation:—

“Seizure of forest
produce etc.

17. Any forest officer or police officer may proceed to seize and detain any forest produce or timber taken, sold or possessed in contravention of the Ordinance or these Regulations, also any tools, mechanically driven tractors, machines, pipes, marking and other instruments, vehicles or animals, by means of which any offence against the Ordinance or these Regulations, was committed.”.
